Interview & Audition information



Dance

At the interview we will discuss the different dance courses available at Chichester College, introduce how we work, and we will establish if this is the right dance course for you.

Entry requirements:

5 GCSEs at C or above including English Some previous dance experience Successful audition

Audition information:

Please be prepared to perform in a dance workshops as part of your audition:

Part 1: A practical dance class which will include an aerobic warm up. Please ensure you wear practical clothes which will allow the teacher to see the line of your body and be prepared to work in bare feet.

Part 2: A solo performance. You will need to prepare a one minute solo dance to perform at the audition, this may be your own composition or a set piece that you have been taught. Please bring your own CD/iPod with your performance music choice.

Interview information:

During your interview with a member of the dance team we will want to know about your previous experience and why you would like to study dance at Chichester College. This is also your opportunity to ask us any questions you may have.



PREPARING FOR YOUR INTERVIEW

Your Interview is an opportunity for you to discuss your chosen course with of the teaching staff and to find out about the college. It is also a chance for you to ask any questions in order to ensure you have chosen the best course for your future plans.

If you, or any person accompanying you, have any individual requirements during your visit, for example disabled parking, please feel free to contact Admissions so that we can make any necessary arrangements for you.

Before the interview:

- > Make sure you know where to go and who to ask for.
- Be on time allow extra time for unexpected delays. (Please be aware that visitor parking is very limited).
- Remember to bring with you all the things that you may need, e.g. Portfolio, evidence that may support your application etc.

If you are still at school or under 18:

- > If it is during school hours, let your school know you have an interview to attend.
- > Your parents/guardians are welcome to attend the interview with you.
- Give some thought to what you will wear, it should be smart, clean and tidy. First impressions do count!

During the interview:

- Prepare some answers to questions you may be asked. e.g.:
 - Why have you chosen this course?
 - How do you think this course will benefit your future study/career choice?
 - Describe any employment/work experience you may have done

If you are still at school you may also be asked the following:

- What is your schoolwork record like?
- What is your attendance and punctuality record at school
- > Prepare some questions that you may like to ask. e.g.:
 - What could the course lead to in the future in terms of further study or career opportunities?
 - Will there be any extra costs for books, materials and trips etc.?
 - How will my work be assessed (e.g. continuous assessment or exams)?
 - What are the IT and library facilities like?
 - What financial or other support is available for students?

This is your opportunity to find out about college life and your chosen course. Good luck!






Chichester College
