

Interview & Audition information



Drama

At the interview we will discuss the different drama courses available at Chichester College and introduce how we work.

Entry requirements:

1. 5 GCSE's at grade C or above, including English Language or Literature (4)
2. Successful interview and audition

Audition information:

Part 1: A physical theatre warm-up/games/improvisation

Part 2: Present a monologue or your choice or one of the monologues on the reverse of this letter. Your monologue should be between 1-2 minutes in length and all lines must be memorised.

Please come dressed in appropriate clothing for movement

Interview information:

An interview with a member of the drama team. We will want to know about your previous experience and why you would like to study drama at Chichester College. This is also your opportunity to ask us any questions you may have.

MALE SPEECH

Please learn and perform the following speech from CHATROOM by ENDA WALSH.

William is fifteen years old. He is sat down on a chair facing the audience.

You know, in the real world it would have been that fat German boy who falls into the chocolate lake at the beginning of the tour. In the real world he's the winner. This is how it ends, right. . . He falls in. His father gets these big-time lawyers to sue the shit out of Willy Wonka. They look into his shady past and his dodgy personal life with those orange midgets! Please learn and perform the following speech from CHATROOM by ENDA WALSH.

Well, as little babies you can't do any wrong, can you? You're bloody perfect! All you do is eat and shit and laugh and cry and sleep and don't sleep, but you're loved. And I suppose you're loved because your parents have this blank page, don't they? And all their hopes and dreams can be projected onto this beautiful little blob. And that blob can't disappoint because it's just a beautiful little blob. But that only lasts a few months until BANG! Suddenly the blob's a little too hungry, a little too loud, and a little less beautiful. PREPARING FOR YOUR INTERVIEW

Your Interview is an opportunity for you to discuss your chosen course with of the teaching staff and to find out about the college. It is also a chance for you to ask any questions in order to ensure you have chosen the best course for your future plans.

If you, or any person accompanying you, have any individual requirements during your visit, for example disabled parking, please feel free to contact Admissions so that we can make any necessary arrangements for you.

Before the interview:

- Make sure you know where to go and who to ask for.
- Be on time - allow extra time for unexpected delays. (Please be aware that visitor parking is very limited).
- Remember to bring with you all the things that you may need, e.g. Portfolio, evidence that may support your application etc.

If you are still at school or under 18:

- If it is during school hours, let your school know you have an interview to attend.
- Your parents/guardians are welcome to attend the interview with you.
- Give some thought to what you will wear, it should be smart, clean and tidy. **First impressions do count!**

During the interview:

- Prepare some answers to questions you may be asked. e.g.:
 - Why have you chosen this course?
 - How do you think this course will benefit your future study/career choice?
 - Describe any employment/work experience you may have done

If you are still at school you may also be asked the following:

- What is your schoolwork record like?
 - What is your attendance and punctuality record at school
- Prepare some questions that you may like to ask. e.g.:
 - What could the course lead to in the future in terms of further study or career opportunities?
 - Will there be any extra costs for books, materials and trips etc.?
 - How will my work be assessed (e.g. continuous assessment or exams)?
 - What are the IT and library facilities like?
 - What financial or other support is available for students?

This is your opportunity to find out about college life and your chosen course. Good luck!
