Health Insurance - Courses Over 6 Months

Since the 6th April 2015 students studying for longer than 6 months will have paid a Health Surcharge when making a visa application. As a result there should be no charge for treatment with the National Health Service (NHS).

You will be eligible for full health care under the NHS, including the treatment of preexisting conditions. This treatment is available from day one of your stay. You will have to pay the usual statutory charges, such as the cost of prescriptions, which are around £9.35 per item and dental and eye treatment which are not normally free of charge.

IMPORTANT: Even if you can be treated by the NHS for most health needs, the NHS does not cover all risks, so you should still consider taking out medical insurance.

Some of the risks not covered: if you fall sick and want to be transported home for treatment or want a family member to stay in the UK to look after you.

You can either buy medical insurance from a company in your own country or one in the UK. You should make sure that your insurance covers all the following areas:

- Emergency medical and other expenses
- Personal accident
- Baggage
- Personal money, passport and documents
- Personal liability
- Missed departure
- Cancellation or curtailment charges
- · Overseas legal expenses and assistance
- Course fees

Please note that, because you are coming to the UK to study and not just as a tourist, standard travel insurance is not enough!
