If there are any trips associated with your course, you will be required to complete consent forms which will be given out by your lecturer during induction week.



Where will I be studying?



On your first day, you should report to the dog grooming parlour. This is located within the Animal Care Centre in The Copse building.



What you need to bring with you

Please bring the following with you on your first day:

- Level arch file with dividers, notebook, pen and camera
- Packed lunch or money for lunch and a bottle of water
- Appropriate clothing for dog grooming and non-slip shoes (no sandals)
- No Jewellery apart from wedding rings and ear studs are to be worn in the parlour

Please note that the compulsory supplement of £50 included in the fees quoted will provide you with a grooming top and some basic equipment.
