If there are any trips associated with your course, you will be required to complete consent forms which will be given out by your lecturer during induction week.



Where will I be studying?



General Information

All students will have completed NPTC Level 2 Dog Grooming Assistants course. This will give sufficient practical experience with preparing dogs for grooming.

You will undertake assessments and exams throughout this course.

On your first day, you should report to the dog grooming parlour. This is located within the Animal Care centre in te Copse building.



What you need to bring with you

A £350 course supplement is contained within the total course fees stated in your final joining information letter. Your course tutor will advise you of the equipment package this will relate to.

Grooming overalls must be worn at all times in the parlour. If you have just finished the Level 2 course, then the overall you used then is ok to use. Any other grooming overall that you may already have which is suitable for the job can be worn too.

College equipment such as clippers and scissors may be used at commencement of your course and advice can be given should you have any relevant equipment already to hand. Please note that once you have received your personal equipment package, it is expected that students bring this in for use during lessons to become comfortable with their own equipment.

Any electrical clippers / equipment must be PAT tested prior to use at college.

Appropriate clothing for dog grooming and flat closed in sensible non-slip shoes (no sandals).

Hand notepad and other suitable writing materials including a level arch file and A4 lined paper.

Camera.

Packed lunch or money for lunch and a bottle of water

No Jewellery apart from wedding rings and ear studs are to be worn in the Grooming

Parlour at any time
