

What you need to bring with you

Winter 'Dress Code'

Hats - Hat rules change in January 2023 so please check your hats and ensure they are correct.

PASO15 2011 along with the Kitemark will be acceptable, but not PASO15 1998 or the SNELL E2001. (See Attached info. Sheet).

Polo Shirts - Navy blue with Chichester College/Equine Team/Brinsbury Campus logo - compulsory.

Sweatshirts - Navy blue with Chichester College/Equine Team/Brinsbury Campus logo - compulsory.

Jackets - Navy blue with Chichester College/Equine Team/Brinsbury Campus logo - optional.

Jackets - Quilted or waterproof dark colours - no sports logos etc.

Jodhpurs - Navy Blue/Black - compulsory.

Chaps - Long chaps (in bad conditions) may be worn in the winter, if wet, at the discretion of the Tutor involved.

Boots - Long leather or rubber. No long boots with laces up the sides or country boots to be ridden in.

Jodhpur Boots - Brown or black to be worn with half chaps, black or brown only.

Hair net - to be worn during riding lessons.

Gloves - Beige, brown or black must be worn.

Whip - Short (30"ins) for jumping, and long (36"ins) for dressage.

BODY PROTECTOR MANDATORY FOR ALL STUDENTS WHEN JUMPING/HACKING. OPTIONAL FOR FLATWORK. Approx. cost £80.00.

Stable Duties 'Dress Code' - (TO BE WORN AT ALL TIMES) : -

Navy blue polo shirt, navy sweatshirts.

Black/Navy jodhpurs and gloves.

Wet weather clothing (dark colours).

IMPORTANT INFO FOR CROSS COUNTRY ACTIVITIES: Only a "Jockey Skull" of an even round or elliptical shape with a smooth or slightly abrasive surface, having no peak or peak type extensions may be worn for any XC activity. Noticeable protuberances above the eyes or to the front, not greater than 5mm, smooth and rounded in nature are permitted. A removable hat cover with a light flexible peak may be used.

HEAD CAMS: When hats are tested against the requirements of a standard, they are done so with no extra additions on the hat i.e. with no head cam attached. Therefore, it is currently not known how the addition of a protuberance such as a head cam, effects how the hat would respond during an impact. Therefore, the use of HEAD CAMS are not recommended at any Approved Centre activity. This includes use on the head, chest, bridle or any other part of the horse or rider.

*In order to ensure riders are wearing the most up to date riding hats, please note that from the 1 January 2023, the following hat standards will no longer be accepted, due to the age of hats made to these standards:

2. SNELL 2001









Work Experience

Routine Duties
