



Private Accommodation:

All the Accommodation offered through Chichester College is managed by the College accommodation team. We would recommend you use the College's Accommodation as this follows strict guidelines to ensure your comfort and safety. This will help you to get the most out of your College experience and for those international students you will find more benefits from being around other students/ host providers and being able to practise your English with others.

However if you prefer to find your own accommodation privately, here are a few tips and contact details you may find useful:

Before you sign:

Be safe, do not go on your own to view a property, take a friend. It is also useful to get a second opinion.

Be sure you are happy with the accommodation, the contract and price before you sign the anything. make sure you have read the contract thoroughly before you sign it. If you can ask a friend or relative to also read it through. Once you have signed it is very difficult to get out of the contract.

Make sure you know what you are signing up to - know your rights as a tenant.
