If you would rather source your own art kit, please see the below list and source the same or equivalent. Please note that the full kit is required for the beginning of term and will need to be used in every class.

Required Art Equipment:

- A3 softback sketchbook, with good quality paper, minimum 110gsm
- A selection of drawing pencils minimum B, 2B, 4B
- Pencil sharpener and eraser
- Sharpie Pen
- Scissors
- Retractable craft knife (small)
- 30 cm metal rule
- Glue stick
- 1 roll of masking tape
- Pens for drawing (black fine liners)
- Paint brushes (small selection of various sizes)
- Small tin of watercolours (Anilinky, Dye based Watercolour set where possible)
- A set of acrylic paints for sketchbook/ artist studies (small tubes, preferably quality brand)

Financial Support: The college has a *means tested bursary* available for households below a set income. This would cover the costs of trips and the art pack. Link: LSG: Learner Support Grant





The course will take place in E Block, Chichester Campus.









Task 1: Visual Language

Deadline 05/09/2025









Task overview and context

Create a **visua**l fact file/top trump card/ dossier about yourself to be used to introduce yourself to your new class. This is a creative task AND it will be assessed, so take your time and enjoy showing who you are through your art!

Task requirements

- 1. Your artwork must be hand drawn/painted on paper (no digital for this piece –that comes later!)
- 2. Use whatever art materials/drawing tools you have access to from a humble biro to a full art kit
- 3. Consider how you can use 'visual language' to express your personality (see over)

What to Include (Required)

Your artwork must include:

Self portrait (Realism)
Your name
Your favourite artist/designer
Your favourite art/design activity

What Else Can You Add? (Optional but fun!)

Make your work even more personal and creative by including:

Other facts about yourself eg Future dream job, where you're from, pets, family, hobbies, superpowers (real or imagined!), favourite music or food, furthest place you've ever travelled to, what school you went to etc.

Top Tips for Success

- Be yourself there's no right or wrong style!
- Think about how everything you draw says something about YOU.
- Make it something you'll be proud to show your new class.

Visual Language

Understanding visual language: the use of colour, shape and style can communicate deeper meanings with the viewer.

The *colours* you use

The style of drawing you create

The choice of *media* you use (media – pencil, pen, felt tip, fine liner etc) Typography - the style of writing you use

Composition - the size and placement of your name and picture - big and bold, or quiet and subtle?

Glossary

Here are some useful words and definitions to help with your task:

Autobiographical

Work based on or involving the writer's/ artists own life: An autobiographical story/ artwork.

Composition

Composition involves placing and arranging visual elements within the artwork, considering their relationship to each other and the overall space

Typography

The visual design of how words appear, going beyond just the words themselves to influence how they are perceived and understood.

Visual language

The language of visual communication, expressed through its formal elements (E.G. Line, shape, form, tone, texture, pattern, colour) to produce images and objects that embody meanings, messages, feelings and ideas.
