

Any fees will have been explained in the starting information/Application Tracker you have now received.

Please note that as your lessons will take place in a laboratory environment, in addition to a lab-coat, you must wear appropriate clothing for safe working.

This means no sandals, flip flips or open footwear and long hair must be tied back.

Please bring a hairband which can be kept in your lab-coat pocket. Eating and drinking is not permitted in the laboratories and lecture theatre within the Department.

For each lesson you should bring: Textbook, calculator, ruler, pen, pencil, sharpener, eraser, notepad, folder for any handouts, course handbook, lab coat for practical sessions.

You will be contacted via email by your Study Programme Leader on GCSE results day to confirm your grades and further information regarding the course will be given to you during your Induction week when you start College.

Please note that all offers are conditional for any student yet to take their GCSE exams. The minimum entry requirement for the course is five grade 4's (C Grade) which must include Maths, English Language and Combined or Triple Science.

If you do not achieve the minimum grades required then you will not be able to start the course in September. You should instead come to on to our YES Options Day just before term starts to discuss alternative courses.
