*English and Maths

NB: All students aged <u>16-18 years on a full-time course</u> are required to update their English and Maths skills if they do not hold a GCSE grade of A/9-C/4 in both subjects. So please be aware that if you do not have these qualifications, you will be required to undertake a GCSE re-sit (or equivalent qualification) alongside your main programme of study. This is compulsory and not optional. Please be aware that you cannot be awarded for one qualification without passing the other
