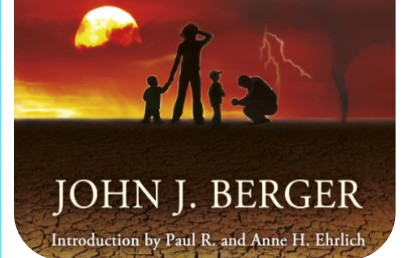

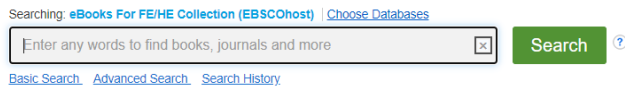

How do I login?

Go to CCGOnline and log in. From the Students dropdown menu at the top of the page, select Library, Library Resources. Go to Online Resources.

Click on the link for EBSCO ebooks for FE/HE.

You will automatically be taken to the homepage and basic search screen.



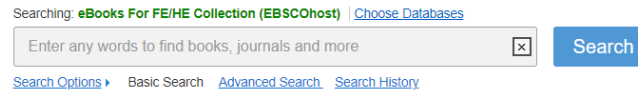
Searching this database from home Click on the link for EBSCO ebooks for FE/HE. If you are not already logged into your CCG Microsoft account, sign in when prompted with your College email and password.

Create a Sign In using the menu at the top of the page and you will be able to add items to your own folder which will be saved after you have logged out.

How do I search?

Basic search

Enter your search term in the box and click search.

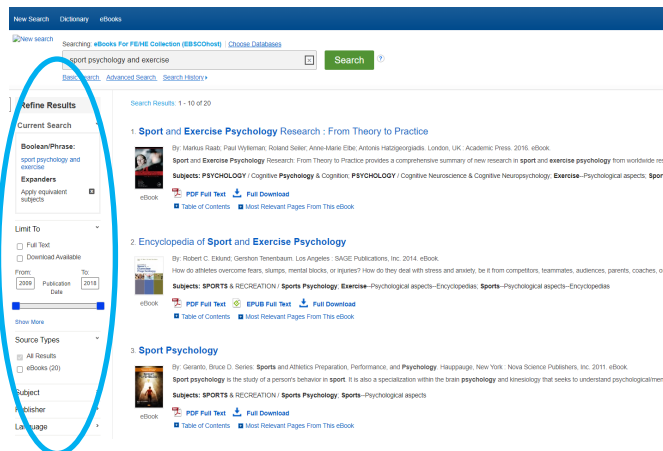


Advanced searching

Click on Advanced search below the search box Enter your search term and select the field to search all fields, author and so on from the drop down menus. Use AND OR NOT. to combine terms.

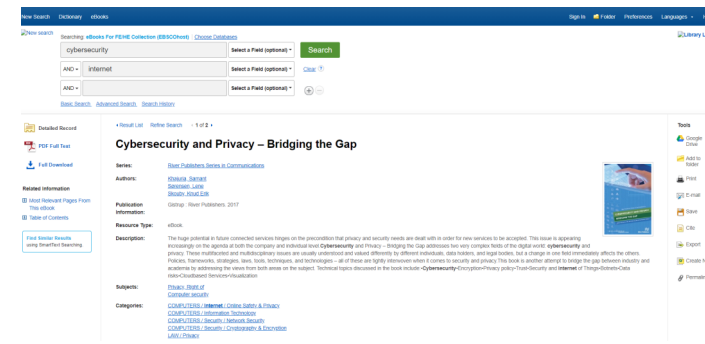
How will the results appear?

Results are displayed in relevance order (change to by date, author or title if preferred). If you have too many results try limiting your search using Refine results on the left of the screen. You can refine results by date, subject and category etc

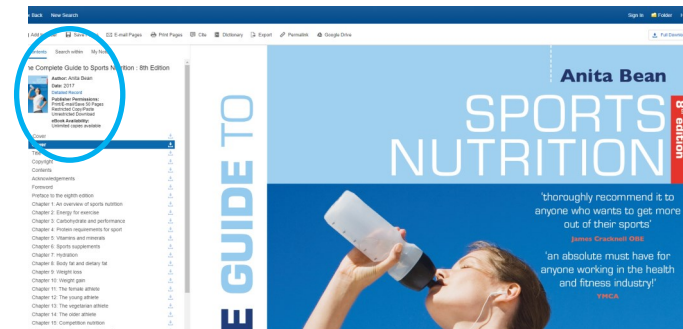


How do I use the results?

Click on a title to get a description of the book and its contents. Access the Tools menu on the right to save, email, print and cite (obtain bibliographic details for referencing).



Click on the PDF Full Text icon to open the full text of the book to read, save or email.



You can search within the book and make notes using the links on the left of the ebook.
