How do I log in?


Go to CCGOnline and log in. From the **Students** dropdown menu at the top of the page, select **Library**, **Library Resources**. Go to **Online Resources**

If you are not already logged into your CCG Microsoft account, sign in when prompted with your College email address and password.


How do I search?

If you choose the elssues Library you can read entire books in the Issues series.






