

## How do I log in?

The easy way to start using EBSCO SocIndex is to go to CCGOnline and log in. Scroll down the page and click on the link to Learning Resources. Go to Online Resources.

## How do I search?

Basic Search < Type in your topic and click 'search.



To narrow down the results you can filter by the **Refine results** section on the left or carry out an Advanced Search. Advanced Search Enter your search term then click Select a field to choose author etc from the drop down menus. Use AND,OR, NOT to

#### combine terms.

## How will the results appear?

Results are displayed in relevance order. The results can also be displayed by date and author if preferred. SocIndex searches include academic journals, magazines, conference papers, dissertations and eBooks. Click on a title to see the full record.

#### Too many results?

If you have too many results try limiting your search using **Refine results** options, for example by date, source type or subject to the left of the screen.



Click on a title to see the full record. Click on the PDF icon to open the full text of the article to read, save or print.



## How do I use the results?

On the detailed record page use the Tools menu on the right of the screen to save, email, print, and obtain referencing details.
