Directive Words

Directive words are the words that give instructions about the way a task (for instance, writing a piece of work) should be done and, for example, often appear in essay titles you need to write for. They are there to ensure that you approach the task in the right way and help you to decide upon the type of information you need to include and how to present this in your written submission.
