
One of the UK's flagship regional theatres, Chichester Festival Theatre is recognised internationally with a reputation for producing work of the highest quality.

PERSONAL SAFETY

Explore the UK safely with friends

Chichester is a very safe city, but to help you to stay safe always – remember the following advice.

1. When you go out, find out where you're going and let your host family or Halls supervisor know and tell them when to expect you back.

2. Plan ahead - how are you going to get there?

3. Always go out with people you know and trust.

4. Always use well lit, busy roads and avoid shortcuts through dark, quiet areas.

5. Walk with friends and never walk alone at night – use a taxi.

6. Stay alert – be aware of your surroundings – don't wear your personal head/earphones when out alone, you won't be able to hear if someone is following you.

7. Don't speak to people you don't know (unless a trusted community officer with proof of ID), or go up to their cars, - even if they speak to you first.

8. Never take money or gifts from people you don't know.

9. Consider carrying a personal attack alarm but not a self-defence spray as they are illegal in England.

10. Do not walk straight into the road; remember to look right when you cross the road – cars in England drive on the left.



UK TRAVEL SAFETY

Here are some tips to keep you safe when travelling.

Travelling around a new country can be exciting and new. However, please keep your health and wellbeing as a top priority when exploring the UK.

1. If you are travelling alone on a bus, train or tube, always sit near other passengers.

2. Plan your route and check the bus or train times before you leave. The phone number for this information can be found in the telephone directory.

3. Never walk across or touch railway lines – they are lethal and cause extreme harm.

4. Only share taxis with people you know.

5. Never tell anyone your personal details.

6. Never carry all of your money or passport with you. Try to carry your valuables such as a phone, camera or wallet out of view.

7. Never leave your bag unattended in public places. It may be stolen or regarded as suspicious.



EXCURSION SAFETY

Join us the team on excursions to popular UK locations.

The International team operates a number of organised trips to towns and cities of cultural and historical interest. To ensure your welfare and safety during these excursions we have put together the following information.

You will be given a map of the town or city you are visiting – make sure to check with the escort the time and place that you are required to meet for departure and return.

Always tell a member of staff before leaving the coach if you intend to make your own way back to Chichester.

Walk on the pavement at all times – remember that vehicles drive on the left in the UK so check both directions before crossing roads. Use pedestrian crossings where possible.

Explore with a friend or in small groups, not on your own and try to stay in busy areas.

Don't carry large amounts of cash but please ensure you have access to funds for situations like missing the coach and having to take public transport back to Chichester. Avoid confrontation – walk away if you are being provoked or hassled.
