EQUIPMENT LIST

The essential items that you will need to hand both at home and in college are listed below. We will provide specialist equipment for fieldwork with the college, but it is good to also have a set of personal equipment suitable for outdoor data collection

Classroom equipment

- A set of pens, pencils, ruler, protractor, eraser and calculator in a clear pencil case
- An A4 folder with dividers to organise your course notes
- An organiser to write down independent study and work deadlines
- A memory stick with a copy of your summer assignment work (See Transition Project for details)

And for field work

- Cost for the residential fieldwork is approximately £150 paid in instalments tbc
- Set of waterproofs (jacket and trousers)
- Warm fleece style coat/ jacket
- Strong boots/ shoes suitable for walking on uneven surfaces
- Rucksack (30 litres)
