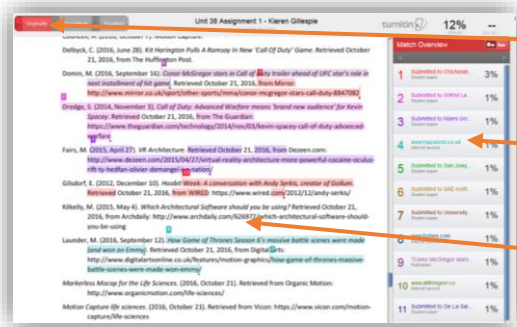
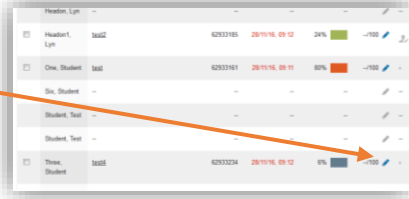


To mark an assignment on Turnitin

Open the Turnitin assignment
click on the pencil beside the first
assignment you want to mark



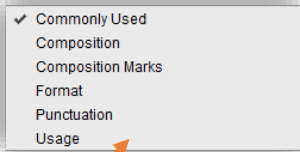
First check the originality report, if this does not show
select the Originality option in the top left corner

The list on the left shows where sources have been
found with percentages

The text has each area highlighted and colour coded
according to the source

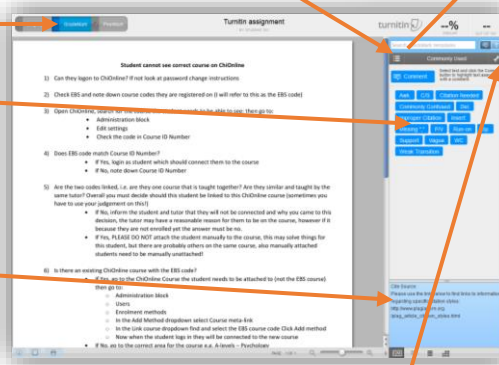
Setup your comments

The list button shows a list of all
the QuickMark comment sets



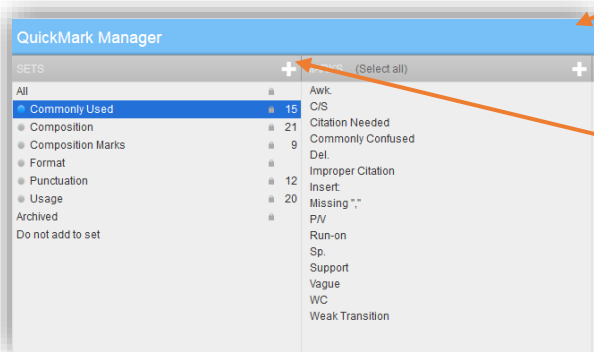
To grade the assignment, select Grademark

There is a list of readymade comments that
can be dragged directly onto the assignment



When you run your mouse over each
comment the extended wording of the
comment is displayed below

The small spanner button opens the Quick Mark Manager



Clicking the + allows you to add a
new set of comments these could
be your pass criteria

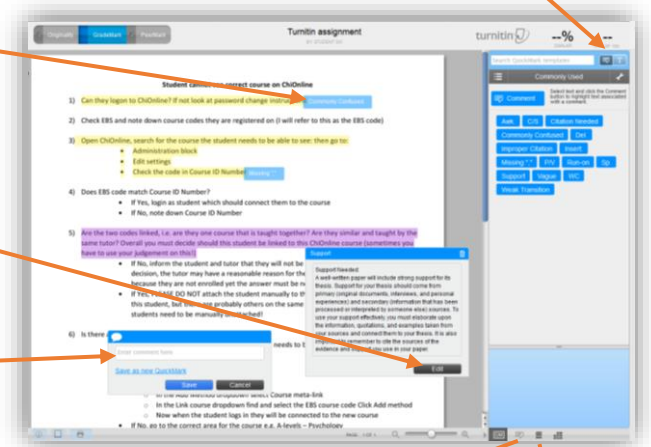
Add comment to assignment

You can also add text directly onto the page switching to the text option

In the assignment highlight the text to be commented on and click on the relevant comment, this links the comment to the text

If necessary, you can edit the comment once added

Or you can click anywhere on the assignment and type individual comments, these can be saved to the bank of comments to use in other assignments



You can leave a general comment about the assignment as a whole
