All	Essay Writing	 0.3 Write an essay entitled: How is language changing and does it really matter? Instructions: Introduction – unpack the question by focusing on what aspects of language are changing, this could include pronunciation of words, the introduction of new words to the dictionary, the influence of social media on language and the differences between your own language use and that of older generations (could be parents/carers, grandparents etc.) Identify, in your opinion, the most interesting thing about how language is changing. Write one paragraph on each aspect you have covered in your introduction focusing on what is interesting about specific words/phrases and how things are pronounced (if relevant). Don't worry if you don't know the correct terms for some aspects of language, write about what you hear/see being used and describe it in a way that will convey the issues. For each point you make in each paragraph, express your opinion as to whether these changes matter or whether you see them as a natural progression of language – be honest and don't be afraid of expressing your ideas in a humorous way if you wish – it makes it more entertaining to read! Write a conclusion which sums up your main points and answers the question 'does it really matter?' Expectations: Make sure your name is on every sheet you use. All essays should be word-processed and should be at least 750 words long. Make sure all spellings are accurate and that you have used correct grammar and punctuation. If you use any texts/links to support your response, please include them in a bibliography at the end of your essay. 	Veek beginning 9 th September 2024
