Psychology is concerned with understanding the experience and behaviour of humans and what makes people 'tick', it addresses questions such as: How does memory work? Does playing violent video games make you more aggressive? And how does stress affect our health? Psychologists carry out carefully designed systematic research studies rather than relying just on their own observations of behaviour or intuition. They gather evidence and form theories about behaviour. You will need to know about the different methods used by psychologists to investigate behaviour.
