talk about an ongoing action in the past (for example, an action that was interrupted by something else that happened):

Trabajaba cuando llamó. = I was working when he called.

describe what something was like:

Pablo era un hombre alto. = Pablo was a tall man.

express the idea of 'used to...' (habitual or repeated actions):

Le encantaba leer autores clásicos. = He used to love reading classical authors.
