Try to photograph your subject in a similar way, for each of the two photographers you have researched in task 1. This could include exploring viewpoint, framing, lighting, shadows, contrast, colour, texture or repetition. Use the viewfinder, to select interesting and dramatic compositions. Select your six strongest photographs and print. Write an explanation of the similarities between your work and the two photographers, you have chosen for your research. 	from 14 th September 2024
