<b>Deadline</b> – Start of term	<ul> <li>Create 4 x A5-A4 sized samples. Experiment with, tearing, cutting, weaving, layering, patchwork to make samples that explore pattern and texture, colour and balance.</li> </ul>	
	You could also use drawing, or hand or machine stitching to decorate your samples.	



	Try to incorporate aspects of the work of the artists listed above in your samples.
<b>Task 4</b> Practical task	<ul> <li>Use your gathered papers to create an inventive garment or sculpture.</li> </ul>
<b>Target Grade</b> – High Grades	Photograph your creation from all angles, and close up to show detail.  Print the photographs ready for your first lesson.
