

# HOW TO SPOT A FAKE VAPE



If you look at the image on the left, there are a few signs to tell which one is fake

1. The fake has text that is poorly embossed on the packaging. It will not contain all the relevant details you get with the real vape
2. The 'verify and register' sticker on the fake vape is wonky. Often the serial numbers on the fake vapes will start with 'the figure 1' whereas the real one's normally start with 'the figure 5'.
3. There are often 'spelling mistakes' on the label and as you can see on bottom half of the packaging the fake image, the word 'Nicotine' appears where on the real vape the correct spelling appears 'Nicotine'.

The fake vapes without the packaging are quite difficult to spot. They carry very little information on them (some none at all)

You should always be alarmed if you are offered a vape with no packaging or at a very cheap price in comparison to what the shops sell them for. Typically a fake vape being sold on the streets, may cost £4 in comparison to one that would cost £6.99-7.99 in a shop.

For Elf Bar, locate the QR code on the holographic sticker. Head to the Elf Bar verification page and enter the code below the QR code; or simply scan the QR code to be taken there automatically.



When you take the Elf Bar out of the box, the logo and the text should be engraved on the device. You can run your fingers over it; you should feel the embossed texture. Most fakes are not embossed, which means it's a fake
